



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members,

This year has produced a much-needed turnaround for California horse racing. The road may have been a bit bumpy at the start of the year after the short-notice

announcement that racing in northern California was shutting down. This was quickly followed by CARF declaring it would not apply for 2025 race dates. Mitigating measures were quickly put in place to help with a transition that would define 2025. Here are some of the key outcomes.

Overnight purses have increased at all racetracks and further increases are expected in 2026. The purse increases, which began on February 28, reversed a declining trend that would have taken the \$60,000 Maiden Special Weight races run during the autumn seasons at Santa Anita and Del Mar down to \$50,000 if the California operating model of two full-time circuits remained intact. Consolidation to a single circuit has helped to restore our California foundation. Remarkably, daytime Thoroughbred handle is down only six percent in California despite a 39 percent decline in the number of races run (1,117 vs. 1,931) through September in a year-on-year comparison. California-based handle on California content and out-of-state racing is down only three percent this season in the transition from two to one racing circuit.

In addition to the purse increases, the daunting purse overpayments that plagued all three southern California racetracks are no longer a concern. In fact, Del Mar and daytime Los Alamitos have a realistic chance of a small purse underpayment at the start of 2026. Santa Anita has also



made considerable progress in greatly reducing its significant overpayment. This was part of the 2025 blueprint to return to a balanced budget in our purse accounts to enable a second round of purse increases in 2026.

There's more. Last month the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) announced increases to the <u>Cal-bred Maiden Bonus program</u>. This is yet another step forward as part of the 2025 turnaround, erasing a big deficit to return the program to solid ground. Effective December 26, Cal-breds running in maiden special weight races at 4/12 furlongs or longer in restricted and open company will receive a \$2,500 increase from \$10,000 to \$12,500 at Santa Anita and from \$12,500 to \$15,000 during Del Mar Summer. The CTBA is now making payments much faster to the winning owner, another big step in the right direction.

Field sizes for 1,245 races during the 2024-25 season have averaged 7.8 horses per race through October 5 at Santa Anita, Los Alamitos daytime and Del Mar. This is a big improvement, and it compares favorably with other major racing jurisdictions. Field size averaged 8.7 during the Del Mar summer meet as compared to 7.6 at Saratoga. Los Alamitos has averaged 7.7 horses per race this year during their five weeks of daytime racing. Everything is pointing up. These metrics illustrate the success of 2025 and the positive momentum as we look forward to the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Del Mar. This marks the third consecutive year the Breeders' Cup has been held in California and the tenth time in the last 14 years.

The 2025 success story coupled with the buzz surrounding the upcoming Breeders' Cup has brought renewed life to California horse racing. As we continue our quest to make optimum use of available resources and improve the value proposition for horse owners, we remain committed to securing ancillary revenue as part of our mission. The coming year will be the one to measure our success. We have achieved everything we possibly can from our single source of pari-mutuel wagering income and hope to add a second layer of income like other major racing jurisdictions throughout the country.

While the Breeders' Cup will move to Keeneland in 2026 and Belmont Park in 2027 for the first time in 22 years, there is no doubt that California is the go-to state when considering quality of climate and venue. Santa Anita and Del Mar are top class options.

We wish all our California owners the very best in the Breeders' Cup and we thank you for your ongoing investment and interest in our sport. We look forward to a big finish to 2025, and look forward to seeing you at our beautiful racetracks.

The Breeders' Cup World Championships return to Del Mar Oct. 31–Nov. 1, 2025

The world's premier festival of Thoroughbred racing makes its fourth appearance at the seaside Del Mar Thoroughbred Club this fall, promising two days of unforgettable international competition and celebration.

Coming up Oct. 31-Nov. 1, the Breeders' Cup will stage 22 races with more than \$34 million in purses and awards. This includes 14 Breeders' Cup World Championships races—all Grade 1 events—alongside eight lucrative undercard races featuring \$1.5 million in purses and awards.

Friday's program highlights the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance Stakes, the Senator Ken Maddy Stakes, and California-bred 2-year-old stakes in the Golden State Juvenile Fillies and the Golden State Juvenile. Saturday's undercard will include the \$300,000 Goldikova Stakes presented by Yaamava' (G3). Reserved seating is allocated to owners, trainers, and breeders with horses competing in the World Championships races. All undercard horsemen will receive complimentary seating and parking on the day their horse runs, plus additional premium amenities. Please note that California Horse Racing Board licenses will not provide admission on Championship days (Fri., Oct. 31 and Sat., Nov. 1). A ticketed seat or general admission credential will be required for entry.

Owner Education Seminar on Horse Welfare and Veterinary Best Practices

The second of the TOC two-part series on Veterinary best practices and horse welfare was featured on October 11 at Santa Anita. The first part of the series was held at Del Mar in August.

This seminar highlighted diagnostic imaging with a visit to the backstretch to see first-hand the resources available to care for our horses. This includes nuclear scintigraphy, MRI, and PET scan. Santa Anita is the only racetrack in the nation that offers all three modalities on site.
